## SECOND ANNUAL REPORT OF THE STATE SCHOOL EMPLOYES' RETIREMENT BOARD

Dear Sir:-

In compliance with Section 4, Paragraph 9, of the Retirement Act, the State School Employes' Retirement Board hereby submits its Second Annual Report. This report is for the school year ending June 30, 1921.

The total number of school employes who had become members of the Retirement System up to July 1, 1921 was 46582 of whom 20725 were Present Employe members and 25857 were New Entrant members. Prior to July 1, 1921, 2055 Present Employe and 3352 New Entrant members had separated from active school service and withdrawn their contributions from the Employes' Annuity Savings. Fund. Among the withdrawals 189 Present Employe and 33 New Entrant members had died, and the remainder separated from School service for other reasons. Six Present Employes and 17 New Entrants, who had withdrawn, returned to school service and again became members of the Retirement System.

During the 1920-21 school year 264 members were granted a superannuation retirement allowance, and 67 members were granted a disability retirement allowance; 22 superannuation and 7 disability annuitants died, and 8 superannuation and 9 disability annuitants returned to active service during the year. The average annual superannuation retirement allowance granted during the 1920-21 school year was \$399.495, and the average annual disability retirement allowance was \$276.508.

During the two years ending June 30, 1921 there were 468 superannuation and 117 disability annuities granted, and the average annuity for the two years was \$349.39 for superannuation, and \$270.755 for disability. During the two years 32 superannuation and



15 disability annuitants died. The average age of all superannuation annuitants for the two years ending June 30, 1921 at the time of their retirement was 69.5 years, and the average length of service was 37.7 years. The average age of all disability annuitants for the two years ending June 30, 1921 at the time of their retirement was 49.2 years, and the average length of service was 25.1 years. The number of members in the Retirement System on July 1, 1921 was 41151 of whom 18629 were Present Employe and 22522 were New Entrant members.

To fill the vacancy caused by the expiration of the term of Miss Grace G. Swan on January 1, 1921, an election was held at the County and District Teachers' Institutes during the summer and autumn of 1920. On December 30, 1920 a committee consisting of H. J. Stockton, Edith A. Sprowles, Frank H. Remaley, J. H. Eisenhauer and Ardee Rorabaugh, counted the ballots for this election and reported that a total of 14090 ballots were voted, of which Grace G. Swan received 11856 votes; Mr. H. R. Jacques received 2081 votes and 153 votes were scattered among other persons. Miss Grace G. Swan was then declared elected for the three year term beginning January 1, 1921. On March 21, 1921 Hon. Aaron S. Kreider was unanimously elected as the seventh member of the Board to succeed himself and to serve for one year beginning March 1, 1921.

The funds of the State School Employes' Retirement System consist of the Contingent Reserve Fund, State Annuity Reserve Fund, State Annuity Reserve Fund No. 2, the Employes' Annuity Savings Fund and the Employes' Annuity Reserve Fund.

The Contingent Reserve Fund receives all payments made to the Retirement System by the State and local school districts on account of New Entrants. The first payments to the Retirement System on account of New Entrants were not due until after July 1, 1920, and this fund, therefore, has no balance from the preceding year. There was due the Contingent Reserve Fund from the State and local school districts to June 30, 1921, the sum of \$478,035.42 of which \$170,269.11 was paid, leaving a balance due amounting to \$307,766.31.

The State Annuity Reserve Fund is to receive from the Contingent Reserve Fund the State annuity reserve of New Entrants who retire with an allowance. Since New Entrants must have a minimum of ten years of service to become eligible to receive a retirement allowance, it follows that there will be no money in the State Annuity Reserve Fund until after the Retirement System has been in operation for a period of at least ten years.

The State Annuity Reserve Fund No. 2 receives all payments made by the State and local school districts on account of Present Employes. The total amount due this fund for the two years ending June 30, 1921 was \$3,391,632.32, of which \$2,201,954.95 was paid, leaving a balance due amounting to \$1,189,677.37. Of the \$1,189,-677.37 yet due \$185,079.74 was due from local school districts and \$1,004,597.63 was due from the State.

The Employes' Annuity Reserve Fund receives the accumulated deductions of the superannuation and disability annuitants, and the contributions of retired teachers who had not received back the money which they had contributed to a local retirement system before its merger with the State Retirement System. The accumulated deductions of annuitants are transferred to the Employes' Annuity Reserve Fund from the Employes' Annuity Savings Fund, and the unreturned contributions of teachers to a local retirement system or their equivalent amounts are transferred to the Employes' Annuity Reserve Fund from the State Annuity Reserve Fund No. 2.

The Pennsylvania School Employes' Retirement System is one of the few retirement systems in this country that has been organized on an adequate actuarial reserve basis. Of the more than one hundred teachers' retirement systems in the United States many have already become bankrupt, and others are rapidly approaching that condition. In the Pennsylvania System the rates of contribution by the members, as well as the payments by the State and local school districts, have been determined as the result of a careful and thorough actuarially investigation. Owing to the lage enrollment in the Pennsylvania School Employes' Retirement System the accrued liability at the time of its organization was heavy, but the accrued liability is being gradually cancelled by the rapidly increasing accumulated reserve. If the provisions of the Pennsylvania Retirement Act are complied with the continued actuarial soundness of the Retirement System is assured.
